Plan to improve race diversity

However, you look at the problem with racial diversity in the Young Liberals, you can't avoid the fact that we are a part of the Liberal Democrats. Therefore, solving the problem in Young Liberals is fixing the problem in the Lib Dems. If the party is seen to be strong on racial diversity and equality, it will increase the number of ethnic minority young members joining us. Background The Lib Dems have many problems when it comes to groups being underrepresented in the Lib Dems such as women and minority genders, LGBT+, and disabled activists. Thankfully, in some areas we have made some progress. We have got away from the ridiculous situation of our parliamentary party

elected in the General Elections of 2010 and 2015 having a 50-7 and 8-0 male to female ratio. In we recently elected a parliamentary party with a much more even 40-32 after 5 years with a female supermajority among our MPs. Though more is needed, it is clear that some progress has been made. Far less progress has been made on the issue of racial diversity, which is still lacking in the party.

Backing Racial Diversity Committee (RDC)

Lots of progress on Gender Balance in the Lib Dems has been thanks to the campaign for Gender Balance (CGB) with the support of Lib Dem Women. Their support of female and minority gender candidates is thorough and professional. This successful model was copied with the purpose of increasing racial diversity, with one significant difference, no funding. On account of this, Racial Diversity Committee has yet to see the dramatic results that the Campaign for Gender Balance has achieved. Though after years of effort RDC was finally given an annual budget, it was only for £5,000, not nearly enough to achieve the stated objectives. I will attempt to make sure that Racial Diversity Committee has sufficient funding to match the results of the Campaign for Gender Balance, by building consensus on Federal Board and Council and by attempting to call in and overturn any Board decision which does not give RDC sufficient resources.

A Better Public Face

Lib Dems in the media often have more confident answers on our core issues and less confident ones on issues that primarily effect ethnic minorities. As someone who did plenty of hustings training in the run up for the General Election, I believe that thorough training can solve this problem and will push for that.
